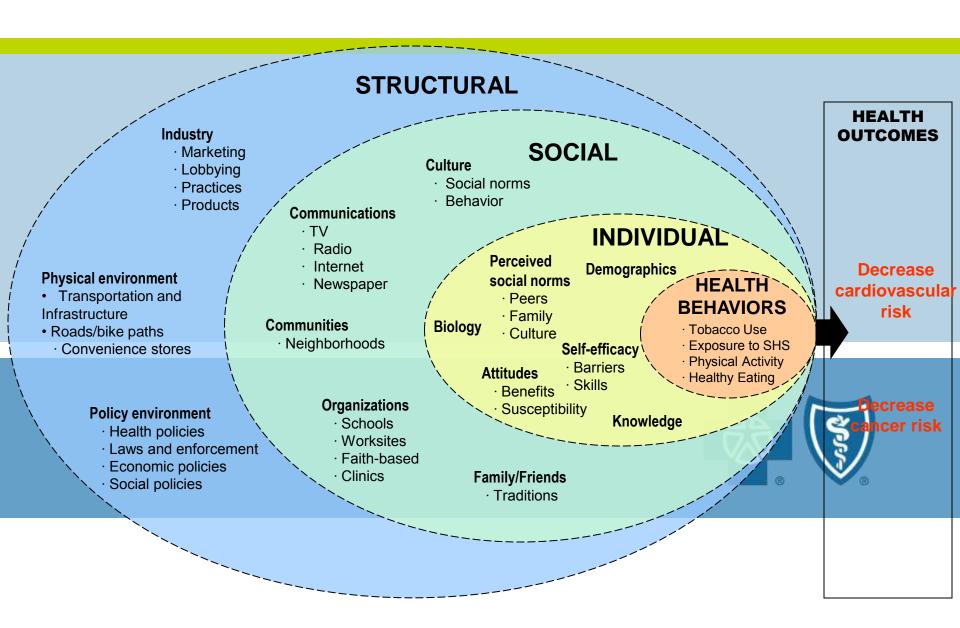

Blue Cross's Approach: Big Levers, Deep Engagement, and Adaptive Leadership

- Prevention = Tragedy and Triumph

- Priorities: Tobacco, Healthy Eating, Active Living, and Health Equity



We Need Science and Power

- > Education is Necessary but Insufficient
- > Policy and Systems Change: (Complete Streets, smoke-free policy, tobacco tax, Institutionalize Health Impact Assessments, Food/Agriculture Policy, etc.)



What is policy and environmental change for Health?

- > **Broad** and **sustainable** improvements that make it easier for people to make health the easy choice.
- > **Policy change:** "Big P" policy change Official rules and statutes approved by elected officials.
 - "Small p" policy change Organizational policies and patterns that drive practice.



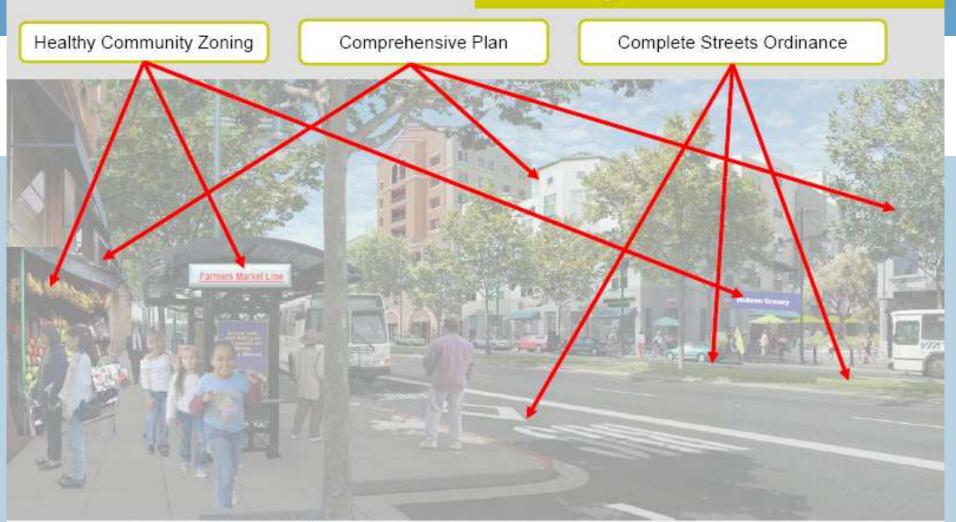

Active Living Community Strategies

Physical activity

- > Complete Streets policies
- > Safe Routes to School
- > Land use and zoning policies that support walkable and bikeable communities
- > Require physical education in schools



Can't Solve Complex Issues with Technical Solutions





Cross Cultural and Interdisciplinary Partnerships

- > Leverage and share knowledge, relationships, and political capital
- > Build alliances with non-traditional partners





Conclusion: Be the Unusual Suspect and "Take the Gloves Off"

- > Conflict, Compromise, and Diplomacy is Necessary for Social Change
- > Power = knowledge, skills, relationships, and resources = GOOD
