

STUDENT SUCCESS

In order to address student success and graduation initiatives, our office assists students with their agency, self-determination, and empowerment while pursuing their educational goals. EDUCATIONAL TESTING

Our ASPIRE Educational Psychologist provides psycho-educational assessments and learning disability evaluations for students who have not been identified. Students then will recieve support, coaching, and advisement as she acts as the liason with Counseling and Psychological Services Center and Disabilities Program and Resource Services.

ASPIRE PROGRAM

The Asian American & Pacific Islander
Retention and Education (ASPIRE) program is
funded by a Department of Education Asian
American and Native American Pacific
Islander-Serving Institutions (AANAPISI) grant.
It is a collaboration between Asian American
Studies and Student Affairs & Enrollment
Management in the Division of Equity and
Community Inclusion. It is designed to support
low-income, Asian American, and Pacific
Islander students both in and out of the
classroom through dissemination of
information, targeted support, and building
learning communities.

LINKED COURSES

Our linked courses are offered in Asian American Studies and Race and Resistance Studies and meet GE requirements.

PEER MENTORS

Peer mentors are trained to work with faculty and staff to provide supplemental support to students enrolled in our ASPIRE linked courses.

STUDY CIRCLES

Our study circles are offered weekly on Mondays - Thursdays from 11:00A to 4:00P in the Cesar Chavez Research Commons in Ethnic Studies & Psychology, Room 100 (EP 100).

FACULTY LEARNING COMMUNITIES

Faculty learning communities are offered throughout the year to increase awareness and foster responsiveness to AA&PI student needs.
