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### **WELCOME BABY**

This is a lite touch home visitation program for pregnant and postpartum women, designed to support women, infants and their families to enhance parental understanding of child development. Welcome Baby serves families from Best Start Central Long Beach, Compton and Wilmington, who are giving birth at St. Mary Medical Center.

### **HEALTHY FAMILIES AMERICA (HFA)**

HFA strives to promote healthy childhood growth and development and build family protective factors through home visiting services. Trained home visitors provide information, education and support to parents related to:

- Parenting skills and how to cultivate and strengthen nurturing parent-child relationships
- Breastfeeding support
- Infant massage demonstrations
- Information and linkages to community resources
- Information on child development stages, and developmental screenings, to help parents know their baby is growing and developing in healthy ways

Screening and information on such family and parental concerns as depression, anxiety, domestic violence, relationship stress and connections to resources and programs

# **COVERED CALIFORNIA and BENEFITS ENROLLMENT CENTER**

Covered California - Certified Enrollment Counselors provide free enrollment assistance for Covered California and Medi-Cal health coverage. To enroll, clients must bring a photo ID, proof of income, proof of citizenship/residency, and tax information.

Benefits Enrollment Center (BEC) – Assist and link low Income Medicare eligible seniors and persons with disabilities to identify benefit programs. With the primary focus being on submitting applications for the following benefits programs: Medicare Part D Extra Help (or Low Income Subsidy, LIS), Medicare Savings Programs (MSP), Medicaid, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Low-Income Home Energy Assistance (LIHEAP).



# **EDUCATED MEN with MEANINGFUL MESSAGES (EM3)**

EM3 is committed to supporting and assisting young men (14-19 years old) in building self-esteem. The youth learn to deal with trauma through writing and the performing arts. EM3 youth gain leadership and decision-making skills in part by delivering youth-targeted messages to the Long Beach Community. The youth work to promote health and wellness among their peers.
